

RIGHTS & RESPONSIBILITIES

Right: No-one should physically hurt you, threaten you, or yell at you!

Responsibility: You should not hurt, threaten or yell at others!



Right: You have the right to decide how to spend your money. You can buy things and keep them.

Responsibility: You cannot take things that do not belong to you. You should take care of your things. You need to pay the people you owe on time and work with your payee.

Right: You can choose the service providers, including Case Manager that works with you.

Responsibility: You need to work with your guardian if you have one to help you make a choice.

Right: You have the right to have privacy. You can talk on the phone in private.

Responsibility: You need to let others have private time too. Do not bother them. You should not spend time with people that might hurt you or do something against the law.

Right: You can choose your religion or you can choose *not* to have a religion.

Responsibility: You should let other people make their own choices about what they believe.

Right: You don't have to take a medicine unless you and your doctor agree.

Responsibility: You should take medicine your doctor thinks will help you be healthy. You are responsible for your own actions.



Right: You have the right to choose who you live with.

Responsibility: You have the responsibility to get along with your roommate and to work your problems out together.

Right: You can tell people about things you think are wrong.

Responsibility: You should tell the truth.



Right: You have the right to make decisions and have responsibilities.

Responsibility: YOU are responsibility for your actions.

Right: You should get paid for work you do. This does not include chores at your house.

Responsibility: If you have a job, you should do what is expected. You should be on time for work.

Right: You can find out about groups who work to make services better.

Responsibility: If you choose to get involved with one of these groups, you should attend meetings.

Right: You have the right to equal treatment under the law.

Responsibilities: You are responsible for obeying the law.
